Pontiac's Measures to Address the Pothole Crisis

Throughout Oakland County and Michigan, there has been an increase of potholes. We are posting this notice to show the efforts the City of Pontiac is taking to address the pothole crisis.

These measures are:

- Addition of a 3rd pothole patching crew
- Saturday patching work
- Currently negotiating the addition of a 4th pothole patching crew
- Posting completed patched areas on the City's website

As we approach the spring and summer months, the City of Pontiac will begin resurfacing and repairing both Joslyn and Orchard Lake roads. Restoration of these two major streets will minimize maintenance concerns in the coming for years.

The City of Pontiac appreciates the public's patience and we would like City residents and visitors to know that the Department of Public Works and our contractors are aggressively working to repair Pontiac's roads as quickly as possible.

We anticipate that as the warmer seasons approach and the ground begins to stabilize, the number of potholes will decrease considerably. Until then, you may continue to report potholes by contacting the Department of Public Works at 248-758-3600 for City local streets, and for roads such as Woodward, Cesar Chavez, Opdyke, etc. For county owned roads, you may contact MDOT directly at 248-451-0001. You may also utilize the City of Pontiac's website by logging onto www.pontiac.mi.us and click-on the tab marked "Citizens Request for Action."
